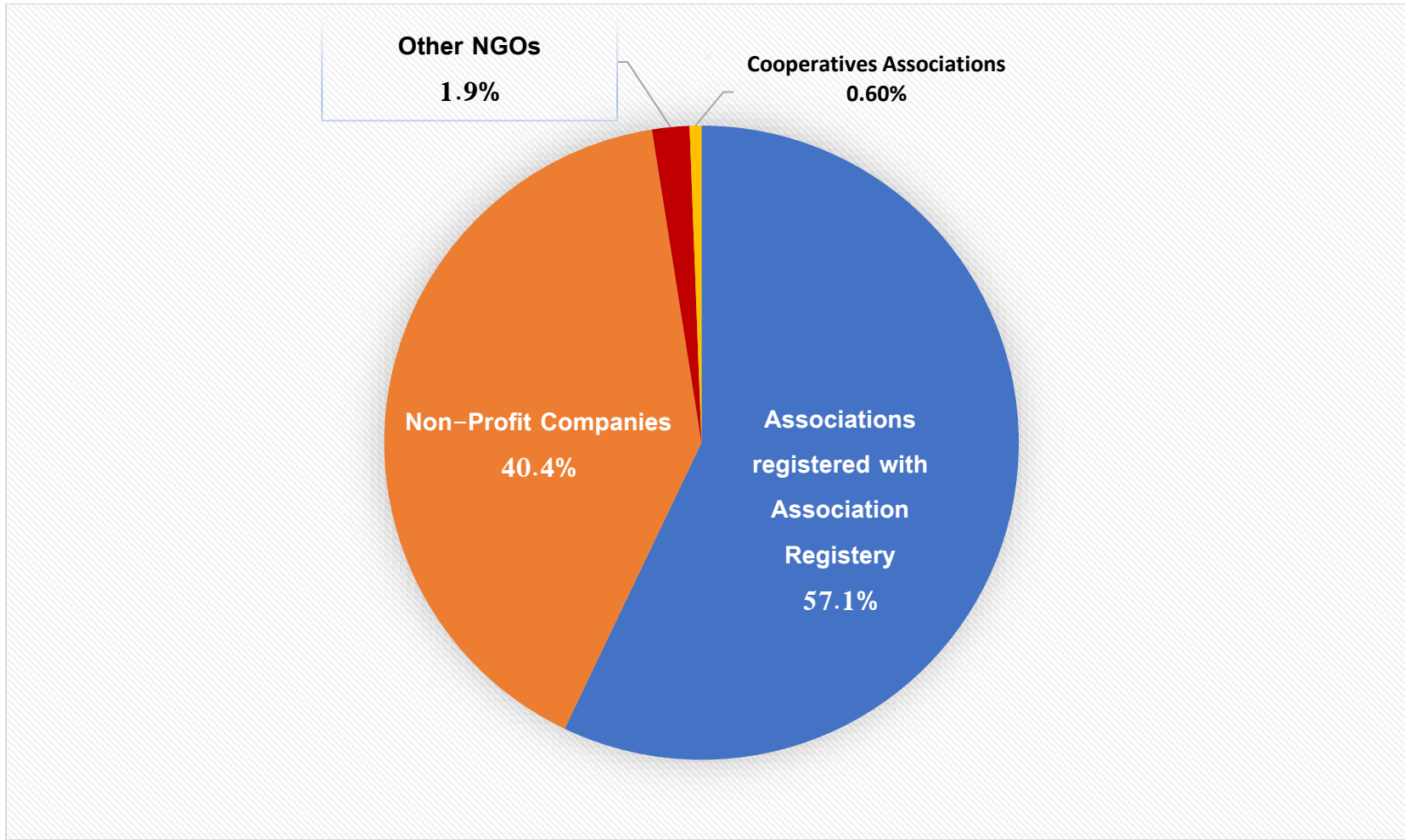

Foreign Funding to Associations, Non-profit Companies, Cooperative Associations and Unions, for the period January – October 2024

Foreign Funding Volume

- The total Funding received by Associations, Non-profit companies, and Cooperative Unions (approved by the Council of Ministers) amounted to approximately 45.5 million JODs to implement (322) projects, of which (1.447) 45.5 million JODs for 5 projects outside Jordan (Jerusalem and Gaza)
- Registered associations received 57.1% of the overall funding, while Non-profit companies received 40.4%, other NGOs received 1.9% and Cooperatives received less than 1% of the total finding.
- In terms of project count, 136 associations received 26 million JODs for 214 projects, while 68 non-profit companies received 18.4 million JODs for 97 projects. The average funding per project stood at 191,500 JOD for non-profit companies and 121,400 JOD for Associations.
- 3 NGOs (neither associations nor non-profit companies) received 0.869 million JODs for 5 projects, while 3 cooperatives received 0.3 million JODs for 6 projects, with average funding per project 173,300 JOD and 50,100 JOD, respectively.

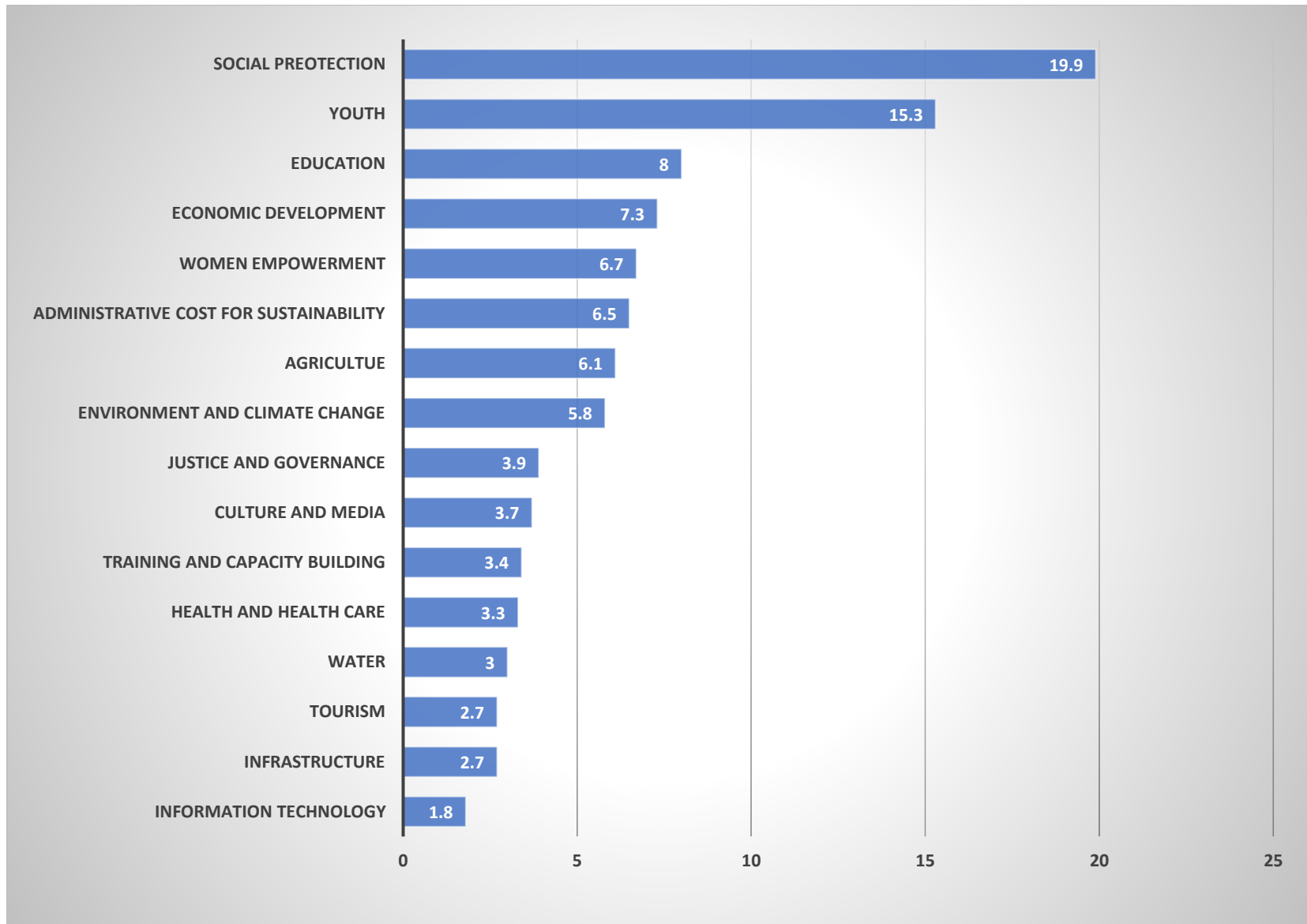
Foreign Funding Volume for the period January – October 2024



Priorities and Objectives

The sectors of Social Protection, Youth, Education, and Economic Development emerged as primary priorities for foreign funding among civil society institutions for the period of January- October 2024. Social Protection led with a total of 9.1 million JODs, constituting (19.9%) of the total funding, followed by Youth with 6.97 million JODs (15.3%), and Education with 3.6 million JODs (8%), and Economic Development with 3.336 million JODs (7.3%). Sectors such as Information Technology, Infrastructure, Tourism and Water held lower priority among civil society institutions and donor communities.
